Worm infestation in dogs is as common as sniffing!

Puppies and adult dogs are prone to worm infestations, leading to serious health issues if untreated. We all know this very well. But knowing the sources of infestation is key to effective prevention and management

1. Puppies acquire worms from their mother too (during pregnancy or while nursing)





- 2. Sniffing infected feces and places leads to inhalation of parasitic larvae
- 3. Puppies are curious. They may ingest soil with worm eggs or larvae while exploring their environment





- 4. Immature stages of specific worms (including larvae) can penetrate even through the skin
- 5. Sharing surroundings with infected pets increases the chances of parasitic infestation





6. Infected prey or food can become ready source for worm infestation
